<b>Program Description</b>	The program aims to cultivate professionals in the leisure industry with competencies in ethics, service innovation, and interdisciplinary cooperation. It seeks to develop students into competitive professionals with a unique skill set, including communication abilities in Mandarin, experience in leisure service, marketing and service skills, management abilities, teamwork, understanding of workplace ethics, social responsibility, and multicultural perspectives.

<b>Work-study During Semester</b>	Students who wish to work in Taiwan (either on campus or off campus) are required to apply for and obtain a work permit before starting a job. With the exception of the winter and summer vacations, students’ total working hours shall not exceed 20 hours per week.			
<b>Employment Counseling</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. The university’s Counseling and Career Development Center offers employment consultation services.</li><li>2. Retention mechanisms are available within each internship organization to encourage students to remain with the company post-graduation.</li></ol>			
<b>Further Education After Graduation</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. After completing their studies and obtaining a bachelor's degree, students can pursue further studies to earn a master's degree in programs such as Gerontology Service Management or Business Administration.</li><li>2. <b>Scholarships and Financial Aids</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. The OCAC provides the following grants and subsidies:<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>(1) The first two years of tuition grant: each new student will be granted TWD 20,000 per semester during the first two academic years.</li><li>(2) Excellent Conduct and Academic Performance Scholarship: Available for those with excellent academic performance. Those who have obtained certificates and competition awards will be awarded TWD 6,000 per person per academic year.</li><li>(3) Medical Insurance for Overseas Compatriot Students (6 months): A total of TWD 600 will be subsidized (before students enroll in National Health Insurance).</li><li>(4) Healthcare: Every student is required to enroll in National Health Insurance and pay the insurance premiums. Students who have proof of economic hardship (or financial difficulty document) are subsidized 50 % of the insurance premiums. (Current monthly subsidy is TWD 413).</li><li>(5) Work-study subsidy and economic hardship scholarship: TWD 2,500 per month for students who are offered work-study opportunities.</li><li>(6) Emergency Aid: Provided on a case-by-case basis.</li></ol></li><li>2. Scholarship and subsidies provided by the University:</li></ol>			

- (1) Accommodation Subsidy: Full accommodation subsidy for the first semester (students must prepay for air conditioning, cleaning, and security deposits).
- (2) Tuition Subsidy: TWD 20,000 per semester for the first year. For the second to fourth years, subsidies range from TWD 5,000 to TWD 20,000 per semester based on the student's class rank and the scholarship budget of the school for that year.
